



2.3.1 - Does your university as a body have a programme in place on student food insecurity/hunger?

In cooperation with the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, Imam Ja'afar Al-Sadiq University follows a management mechanism for food safety and hygiene on the campus to conduct on-site orientation every academic year. Imam Ja'afar Al-Sadiq University has also established a Food Management Committee to coordinate work across all faculties in the university. Nurses assigned to act as hygiene supervisors inspect catering spaces each week such as cafeterias, and check the safety of food served on campus to teachers and students. The university attaches great importance to food safety and helping students in case of hunger.

The University's courses that are taught in its many faculties are another strategy to address the challenges of food poverty and hunger among students. Numerous courses on health and nutrition have been introduced into the educational curriculum to teach students about nutrition and prepare them for issues linked to nutrition. Public health and statistics, nutrition, community and public health, and health management and administration are a few of these subjects.





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
