



4.3.3 - Does your university as a body educational host events at university that are open to the general public: executive education programmes (this refers to short courses for people who are not attending the university; this specifically excludes courses like MBA) and/or vocational training?

Numerous career-related promotion education courses are planned by Imam Ja'afar Al-Sadiq University. Additionally, it collaborates with regional governments and business associations to offer on-the-job talent training. The government has given the Continuing Education Center control over a number of national licensing training programs, which have received unqualified appreciation from both the government and the general public. Some conducted courses are described below:

1. In collaboration with the Faculty of Law, Continuing Education Center at the Imam Ja'afar Al-Sadiq University offered a number of training programs to prepare for the Bar Association entrance test.
2. The Continuing Education Center at Imam Ja'afar Al-Sadiq University, in cooperation with the College of Information Technology and its two departments (Computer Technology Engineering and Communication Technology Engineering), held several training courses to join the Engineers Association.
3. Imam Ja'afar Al-Sadiq University frequently organizes second expertise and enhancement courses each year to help in-service teachers develop their professional teaching abilities and meet the demands of the Ministry of Education and secondary school teachers for continuous learning. In 2021, 32 courses totaling 980 training hours and 562 students were held.
4. The university has also held a lot of activities aimed at teaching women in sewing and other handicrafts. Furthermore, workshops targeted at preventing violence against women were organized by university





formations. The university also formed a unit called the “Women Empowerment Unit at Imam Ja’afar Al-Sadiq University” to follow up the requirements of female students and teaching staff. Finally, the College of Law, in cooperation with the Women's Empowerment Unit and the Center for Continuing Education, held a scientific symposium entitled (Positive discrimination for women between international conventions and Iraqi legislation), on the occasion of International Women's Day, today, Tuesday 8-3-2022.
